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Year 10 Exams

For most students, the Year 10 mock exam series will be the first experience of sitting a number of important assessments, in examination conditions and in quick succession. The purpose of these exams is to give you experience of what exams will be like in year 11 and to practice exam skills and techniques. The outcomes will give you a good idea of how you are progressing in each subject and help you to highlight the areas where you can improve.

There are a number of things you can do to make sure you feel prepared and able to do your best.

1. Start early with your revision, do little and often. Don't leave everything until the night before the exam.



2. Build a team and get help from others. These people can be teachers, friends, parents, older siblings or even grandparents!



3. Have a plan. Break down what you need to do into bite-size chunks.



4. Make time and space to study. Avoid distractions. Organise your notes.

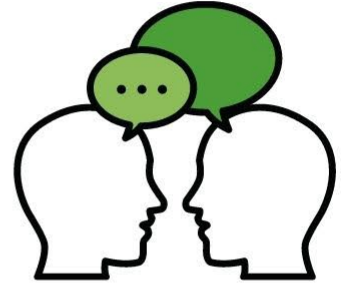


5. Keep going with co-curricular activities and out of school clubs and activities - work your study around them, the down-time is really important for your wellbeing.

6. Talk to someone if you are finding things difficult – your tutor, parents, or another trusted adult.



7. Get your equipment sorted to avoid last minute panics on the morning of the exam. Know where your exam will be and get there at least 15 minutes before the exam is due to start.



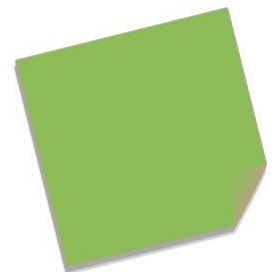
8. Eat well and get a good night's sleep. Don't miss breakfast on the morning of your exam.



9. Make sure you know which topics you need to revise for each subject. Use this booklet as a revision list.



10. Make your revision active. Don't just read notes. You could make flash cards, mind maps or use post it notes.

Teachers have produced this booklet to help you prepare effectively for the upcoming exams. Each subject has set out the topics for revision and resources you can use to prepare for the exam. Teachers will also set structured revision activities as part of your homework.

You can access your personalised exam timetable on EduLink and this will tell you where the exam will take place and your seat number. It is important you sit in the correct seat. A summary of the rules and regulations everyone has to follow in exams is included in this booklet.

It is reasonable to expect that in the build up to year 10 exams that you will do 1 - 2 hours of additional study per week in preparation for each of the subjects you are taking. Spread this out across the week using a revision plan to make the most of the time you have to prepare. Avoid long periods of revision - 20 minute bursts of revision on each topic are known to be more effective than trying to do 2 hours of revision, with no breaks.

It is normal to feel nervous about these exams and you may notice feeling new emotions or being more tired than normal. If you become concerned that you are experiencing excessive exam related stress it is very important to tell someone about how you are feeling so that you can be supported. You **MUST** be on time for ALL of your exams – read your timetable carefully.



2
If you are running late for any reason you need to get in touch with the school admin/exams office immediately.



Please stress to the receptionist - it is urgent regarding exams.

Summer 2022 external exams:

Afternoon sessions begin at **1.15pm**

Exam times will be on your individual exam timetable

You should try to **arrive at least 15 minutes** in advance of the start time.

You will be called into the exam venue when we are ready and you will then find your seat. This will have been printed on your individual Timetable, BUT please also check the seating plan outside the main venue to double check as changes are sometimes made.

Possession of a Mobile phone or any electronic device that can connect to the internet or has a data storage device is strictly forbidden and not allowed inside the exam hall **even if it is switched off** – **No watches are allowed into the exam room**

If you break this rule then it will result in disqualification - not just from one exam – **but possibly from all of them.**

You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.

Before the exam we will collect your mobile phone if you have one. Any smart watches should also be handed in, 'normal' watches should be removed and placed on your desk.

Remember you are not allowed to bring any papers or books into the exam with you – for English literature exams if necessary the texts will be provided for you.

You will be asked to check your pockets for unauthorised items e.g. notes or a timetable

Possession of unauthorised objects is breaking the rules – even if you have no intention of using them.

Calculators, if they are allowed –you must check for stored data in the memory before the exam.
NO calculator lids are allowed.

You are allowed **WATER only**, in a clear plastic bottle into the exam room – the label **must** be removed. Anything other than water in a clear bottle will be confiscated by the Invigilator.



NO food is allowed in the examination room.

7
Your pencil case should be clear plastic. Remember to use black pens. You must bring full equipment.
NO correcting pens, highlighters or gel pens can be used in your answers. (you may highlight questions)

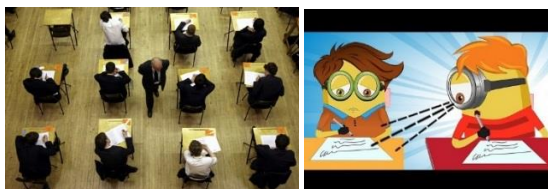


You must not borrow anything from another candidate during an exam.

Once you enter the exam room you should not talk to anyone else – you are now under **strict examination conditions**.

You **MUST** not turn around but face the front of the room and **listen** carefully to the invigilator.



You need to understand that cheating in any form will not be tolerated. You risk the exam you are sitting plus any others you have sat being marked as zero. We and Exam boards operate under very strict guidelines.

If you have a question before or during the exam – raise your hand. An invigilator will come to you



Do not talk or try to communicate to anyone other than an invigilator once an exam has started. If you have a query / need extra answer booklets, tracing paper, a tissue, the toilet... the invigilator will try to help you.

If you use a word processor in exams make sure you log on using your **exam user ID and password**

- save immediately – date, name, exam information.
- Also put your candidate number, centre number, your name, exam name and codes at the top of the word processor document **and** on the examination paper (if using this as well) .
- Remember to use double line spacing and 12 pt font

SAVE REGULARLY. The school is not responsible if you do not save your work and lose it – you will **NOT** be given the exam time again. Follow the instructions for the end of the exam carefully regarding printing.

Make sure you have the correct paper in front of you – if not raise your hand immediately and ask the invigilator to check.

Read the paper carefully and follow the instructions.

Cross through work you do not want marked.

Sit at your desk in silence once the exam is over until you are told to leave row by row.

Some students may still be taking an exam - **be quiet** and respect them.

Do not talk until you are completely outside the exam room

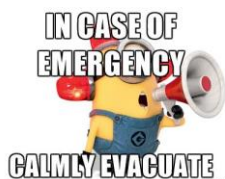
Do not remove anything from the exam room other than those items you brought in.

EMERGENCIES – remain seated and silent and follow the instructions of the invigilators.

If you need to evacuate the exam room, the invigilators will escort you to your usual designated register area on the tennis courts. You **MUST** remain silent.

When instructed you will re-enter the exam room in silence and be told when to re start. The time of the disruption will be added on to the exam time and if a GCSE exam, special consideration will be applied for from the exam board.

AN INSPECTOR CALLS

- Events – be clear on the order of who the Inspector speaks to and how they have impacted Eva's life.
- What their actions represent - the subtext to what they do.
- Characters – how Priestley is using each character to make a point. Look at their political views (Left/Right, Socialist/Capitalist)
- Themes – look at Priestley's message around social responsibility, the gap between rich and poor, how society needs to change.
- Context – how people lived in 1912 and 1946.
- Learn key quotations that link to themes and characters.

MACBETH

- Tragic Hero and how Macbeth falls.
- Characters – especially Macbeth, Lady Macbeth, The Witches and Banquo.
- Themes – betrayal, false appearances, succession, violence.
- Context – the Witches, James I, succession, Gunpowder Plot.
- Revise key images in the play – weapons, how Macbeth kills and how these change, references to birds.
- Learn key quotations that link to themes and characters.

POWER & CONFLICT POETRY

- Revise central themes – war, nature, power, death, conflict, childhood, memory.
- Then find relevant poems that fit with each theme.
- Look for key quotations from the poem.
- Be clear on methods – how a poet creates meaning through their choices in the poem.
- Be clear on links between the poems – you will be asked to compare, so make sure you are linking poems in pairs as you revise.

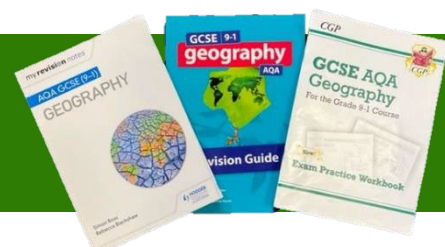
