Cheddar Cheese Burgers

Ingredients

(makes 6)

- 65g cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 small onion finely diced
- 1 egg beaten
- 1 tbsp ketchup
- 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 500g Beef mince

<u>To Serve</u>

- 6 burger buns
- Lettuce
- Tomatoes
- Extra cheese for burger



Serving suggestion: Sweet potato fries, potato salad and salad

<u>Method</u>

- 1. Preheat grill to medium heat or BBQ.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together the grated cheddar cheese, diced onion, egg, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce, salt and pepper.
- 3. Mix in the beef mince by hand and form into 6 even-sized patties.
- 4. Place patties on the grill or BBQ and cook for six minutes per side (for well done), or until desired cooking preference.
- 5. Assemble burgers with buns, cheese and salad.

Preface:

After France fell in 1940, Britain was on its own. As Churchill historically said: "Britain would surrender." not However, relying we were on shipments from America to keep the country afloat. The German *Bismarck* was the largest battleship ever to be built during World War II. It could travel at around 35 mph, was 251 metres long overall and carried a crew of 1,962. It was a complete violation of the Treaty of Versailles and was a symbol of Nazi strength. It was also much stronger than any British ship. A shell crashed into *The Hood's* upper deck, causing severe damage. *The Hood*, realising its mistake, retargets the *Bismarck*. More fire rains from German decks, and *The Hood* bears more damage than it can take. It was soon to be game over for the pride of the Royal Navy.

The Ultimate Guide to

What is Virtual Reality?

'Virtual Reality' or 'VR' is a computer-generated environment that is designed to immerse the user in a virtual world. For example, you put on a headset and you see an undersea picture of a fish. You are able to look around you and see all types of wildlife by moving your head! There are many types of VR, but I will be exploring only two categories in this article: Three Degrees of Freedom (3DoF) and Six Degrees of Freedom (6DoF).





What is '3DoF VR'?

This is the type of tracking is most commonly used. To keep this simple, '3DoF' means that you can look around your environment but you cannot move in it. Most mobile headsets such as 'Google Cardboard', 'Samsung Gear VR' or 'Oculus Go' use 3DoF. Systems such as 'Samsung Gear VR' or 'Oculus Go' have a controller. The controllers tend to act like laser pointers, where you point and click at the target. This adds another level of immersion. But since it is running on a phone or mobile processor, it low quality screens can cause motion sickness in certain experiences, (which is definitely off putting.)

Which headsets use '3DoF'?

- Oculus Go (£199)
- Samsung Gear VR (£100 [Compatible Phone Not Included])
- Google Daydream (£99 [Compatible Phone Not Included])

'3DoF VR' Conclusion

'3DoF' is perfect for people who want to experience 'Entry-Level VR' at a fair price. This is also for younger users who are below the recommended 13+ age limit for the better, but also heavier '6DoF' systems







Virtual Reality

What is '6DoF'?

'6DoF' Stands for 6 Degrees of Freedom. '6DoF' is

the same type of tracking as '3DoF' but, unlike '3DoF' where you in a fixed point, you can walk around your play space. This type of 'VR' supports motion controllers ('HTC Vive Wands' and the 'Oculus Touch'), which give you virtual hands in the game. This is called 'Hand Presence' which is key to 'VR' because it allows to interact with the game just as you would in real life: grab, throw, punch and more. This takes the immersion to a whole new level. But there are some downsides. To run almost all '6DoF VR' you need a powerful (and expensive) gaming PC. You also need to have long cables running from your head across the floor and to your PC, which could be hazardous.

Which systems use '6DoF'?

- HTC Vive(£799 [Compatible PC Not Included])
- Oculus Rift S(£399 [Compatible PC Not Included])
- Valve Index(£999 [Compatible PC Not Included])





<u>'6DoF' Conclusion</u>

'6DoF VR' is the best way to play 'VR' but only if you have a good enough PC. If you don't have a powerful PC but still want the full experience, read onwards about the perfect VR headset for you!



Answer to my Prayers!

Over the past few weeks, I have had the honour of owning an Oculus Quest. An 'all-in-one 6DoF' system. It comes equipped with built in tracking that is equal (if not better) tracking than the 'HTC Vive'. Included with the headset are a pair of upgraded 'Oculus Touch' controllers. This headset has amazing graphics and an incredible game library which is constantly growing. You can have full room-scale games and experiences with no wires needed. In conclusion, I think that the Oculus Quest is INCREDIBLE and worth the £399 price tag.

What to Buy

'VR' is not a must have. A cheap £5 Google cardboard that you put your phone in works as a first experience. But if you want 'the real deal' and have a powerful enough gaming PC, get an 'Oculus Rift S'. If you want the same '6Dof' experience but don't have a gaming PC, look into an 'Oculus Quest'.

Either way, always do your own research when buying anything. This is **ONLY** a recommendation.
