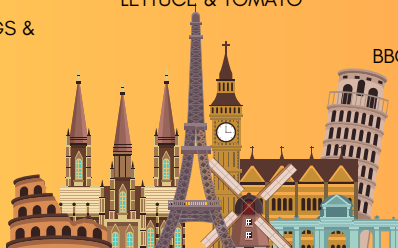

Year 11 have been given distinction awards for amazing work in Science on inherited disorders. Well done!

Cystic Fibrosis
 - characterised by very thick mucus
 - mucus secretions replace become clogged

HEALTHY vs **CYSTIC FIBROSIS**

Air not A gas!
 - lungs are clogged up by the thick mucus which stops them working properly
 - the pancreas cannot make and secrete enzymes properly because it is blocked in the small intestine which stops it releasing its enzymes into the small intestine
 - the reproductive system is also affected in some people with CF as it is blocked

Genetic Fibrosis
 1. the symptoms of this disease are to prevent anything getting better (cystic)
 2. the genetic disorder due to a dominant-recessive gene
 3. treatment involves physiotherapy and medication to help the lungs clear out mucus and prevent infections

POLYDACTYLY

Polydactyly is caused by a dominant allele, there are 3 types of polydactyly:

- preaxial (radial)
- central
- postaxial (ulnar)

CYSTIC FIBROSIS

Cystic fibrosis is characterised by very thick mucus. The very thick mucus can clog up the lungs making it difficult for the lungs to work properly. The reproductive system is also affected for people with cystic fibrosis which can make them infertile. There is no cure to CF however there is medication to thin the mucus making it easier for people to breathe. It is caused by a recessive allele.

CYSTIC FIBROSIS

Cystic fibrosis is a genetic disorder that affects many organs of the body

Symptoms:
 organs, specially lungs, can become clogged up by the thick sticky mucus which as a result stops them working properly

Cystic fibrosis is a recessive gene which means you only can get it if both parents carry the gene and if only one parent carries it you only have the gene not cystic fibrosis.

You can get treatment includes physiotherapy and antibiotics to help keep the lungs clear of mucus and infections. However, the treatments are getting better but there still is no cure.

Home school contact in case of absence

Please can you ensure you carry out the following if your child is absent from school:

Students needing to go out of school during the day:

If for some reason a student has to go out of school during the day, e.g. to the doctors or dentist, please report the absence on Edulink or email studentabsence@lutterworthhigh.co.uk

Students late getting to school:

If a student is late getting to school they should report to the Main Reception and sign in. All students must have a valid reason for lateness, this should be reported on Edulink or by a phone call from home. Lateness, without good reason, will result with a break detention.



Leave of absence in term-time

Leave of Absence

Taking leave of absence in term-time will affect your child's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to help their child by not taking holidays in school time. Headteachers are no longer able to authorise any term-time absence unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Safety

As a school we are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of the young people in our care. Follow the absence with a letter confirming the reason for the absence on your child's return:

- If a student is absent and no reason has been provided by 10.00am, a text message will usually be sent requesting a reason for the absence.
- Non-urgent appointments should, wherever possible, be made out of school hours. Without a reason, any absence cannot be authorised and must go down on a student's record as an unauthorised absence.
- Attendance records form part of the annual report which goes home to parents.

If you have any concerns or queries regarding your child's attendance please do not hesitate to contact the school. We have a network of support in place for parents and students who require it.

Applications of Leave

All applications for leave must be made in advance (see our website) and in making a decision, the school will consider the circumstances of each application individually and you will be notified of the decision in writing.

Any period of leave taken without the agreement of the school, or in excess of that agreed, will be coded as unauthorised and may result in a Penalty Notice being issued to parents.

The school can request a Penalty Notice to be issued from the Pupil Services Court Team at Leicestershire County Council. A Penalty Notice is £60 per parent per child, to be paid within 21 days. Failure to pay the fine(s) within this timescale would mean the fine rising to £120 to be paid within 28 days.

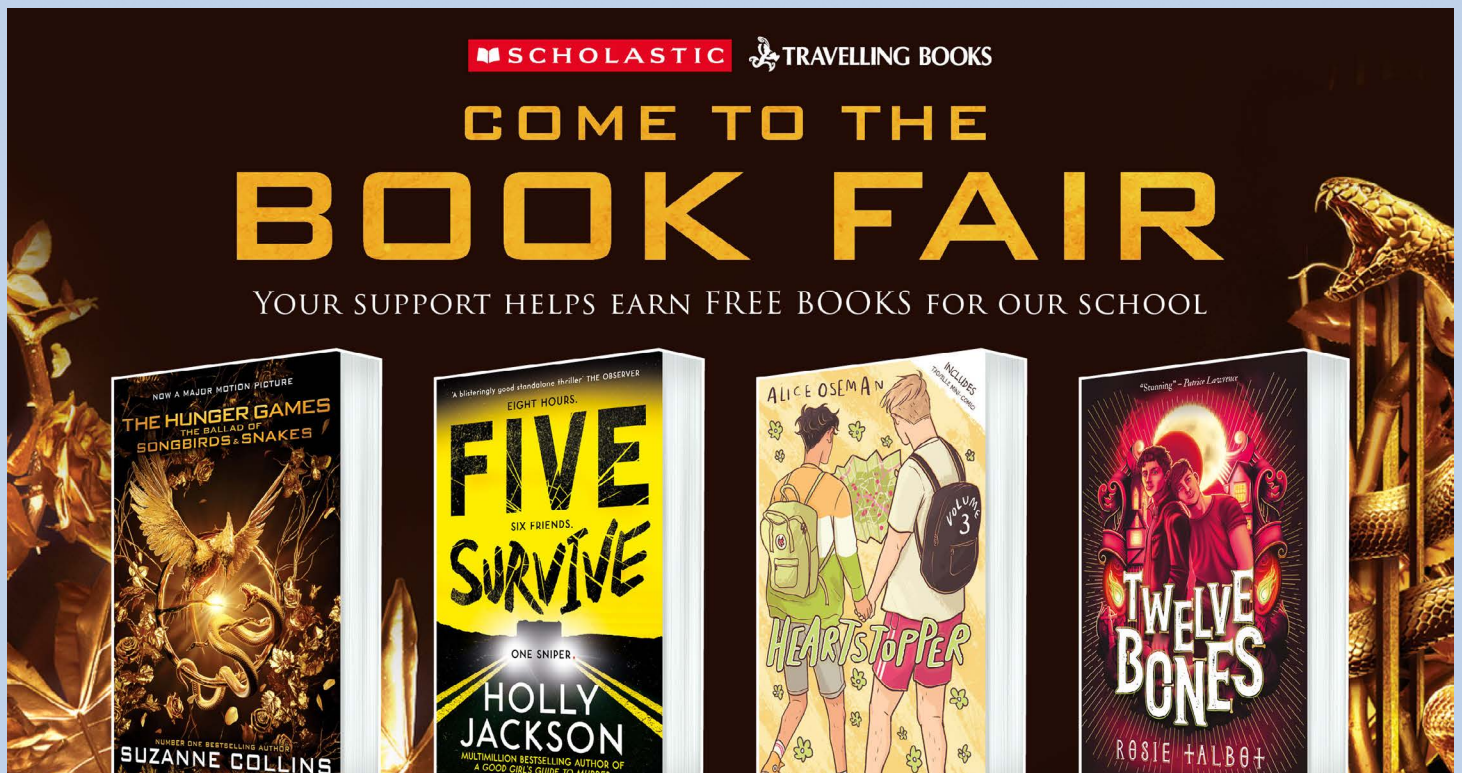


The Book Fair is coming!

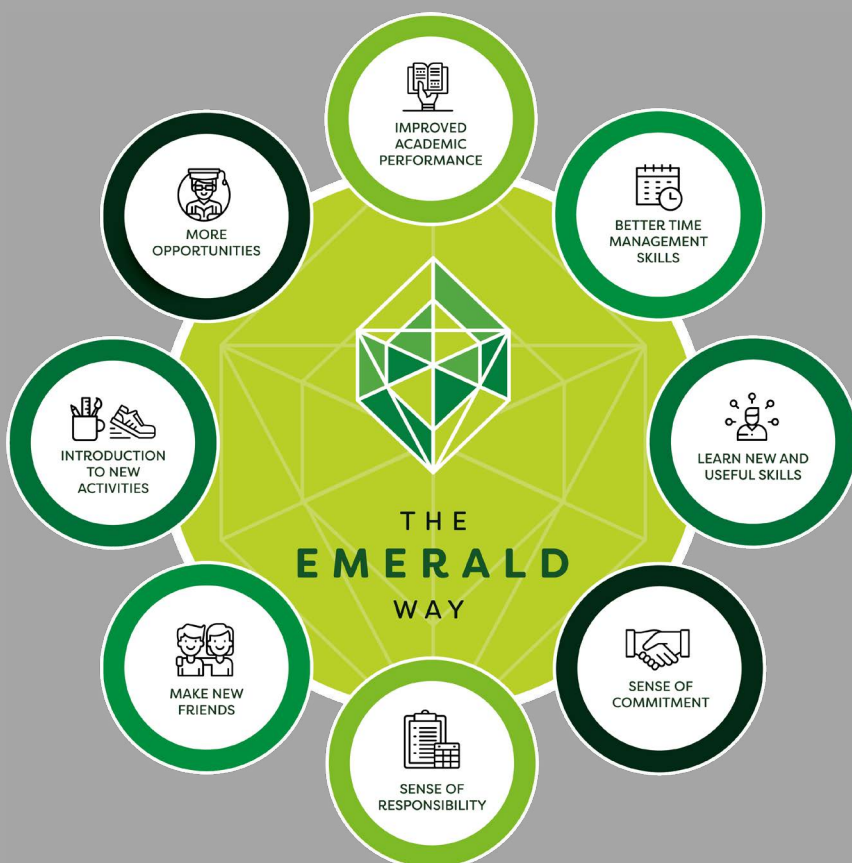

Running Foxes Winter Coaching Programme

Following the successful running of last years winter coaching programme, Leicestershire County Cricket Club will once again be running a winter coaching programme this coming winter. The Running Foxes Winter Coaching Programme is designed to offer boys and girls across Leicestershire and Rutland 18-weeks of coaching to help fulfil their individual potential by offering a winter programme that complements their club cricket. The programme involves weekly hard ball cricket sessions at training centres across the county for U11, U13, U15 and U19 age groups and will run across the winter from November 2023 – March 2024. The aim of the winter programme is to provide coaching to players of all abilities throughout the winter and allow them to perform more consistently by having set targets based upon Key Performance Indicators (KPI's) deemed appropriate for each age group.

Expression of Interest:

Players can be put forward for the winter programme by their club, school, parents, or guardians. Players will be observed over the early weeks of the programme and coaches will, where possible, allocate players to groups that are suitable for their learning and development. Players and parents will be notified by the coaching team if this affects them.

The expression of interest form and additional information will be sent out to all Leicestershire and Rutland cricket clubs and schools who will be encouraged to share the information with players and parents who might be keen to attend. By completing the expression of interest form it does not mean you have to sign up to take part in the programme but will give Leicestershire CCC an indication of potential numbers to be able to allocate suitable venues and sessions to specific age groups. The link to the form is located at the bottom of this document.

Please note that by attending the Running Foxes Winter Coaching Programme players will not automatically be nominated to attend trials for the respective Boys or Girls County Age Group Programmes. Nominations for these trials will be sent separately to clubs asking them to nominate players they feel may meet the required standard for these programmes.



Process:

- 1 Expression of Interest form is sent to previous attenders as well as school contacts and cricket clubs to be sent to parents to complete
- 2 LCCC allocate players into potential groups
- 3 Parents that have signed up receive details of the session that has been allocated to their child and an online registration link
- 4 Parent's book their child onto the programme using the online registration link
•N.B. If player can not attend the session allocated, please contact the Lead Coach. Alternative options will be explored
- 5 Once registered, parents / guardians will receive a confirmation email which includes all information you'll need for the first session

Cost:

The cost for the 18-week Winter Programme will be £200. Payment can be made either in one lump sum or two instalments on prior to the start of the programme and the other in the New Year. We can also accommodate payment plans, to discuss this you will need to contact the Lead Coach using the details below.

It's easy to use and is accessible from a smart phone, tablet or PC. You can use the app to report an absence easily and also book appointments for your child's Parents' Evening.

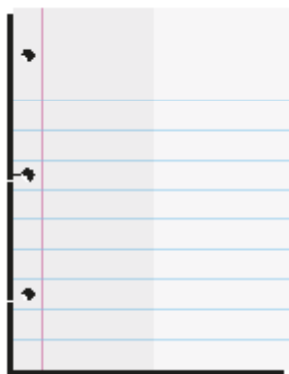
