LEICESTERSHIRE, LEICESTER CITY & RUTLAND SCHOOLS CROSS COUNTRY LEAGUE 2023

This year's schools cross country league for all children in years 3-13 will be held at a new venue, Mallory Park, Kirkby Mallory LE9 7QE on Saturday 28th October 2023, Saturday 18th November 2023 and Saturday 2nd December 2023.

- In a change to previous years, parents/carers are now required to pre enter their participants online. This will then allow the organisers to allocate each child their own "race number" which will be used for all 3 league events.
- Entries will be taken until Sunday 8th October (there may still be opportunity to enter on the day).
- On arrival at the first event, parents will need to go to the entries tent to collect the number(s). This must then be worn on the chest during the race so that the organisers can record the finish position of each child as they come through the finish tunnel.
- It is hoped that this new format of recording the results live on the day will speed up the process of collating and then publishing the final results online. Participants will still be issued a ticket with their score on as they enter the funnel.

Mrs Tomlinson will be present at these races to provide guidance and support for LHS students. Please let her know if you have signed up your child, so she knows how many students to expect on the day.

To enter online and for all information regarding the league events, including parking, course maps and race timetable, please ask your parents to visit the dedicated website www.primarycrosscountry.org.uk . They can also join the Facebook Group "Cross Country" for the latest updates.

There will still be a charge for car parking (amount still to be confirmed). Drivers will no longer be asked to pay on entering the carpark, but instead need to purchase a token once inside the venue and present this token on exiting the carpark. Carpark stewards will be on hand to assist and card reading machines will be available.

Mallory Park is a DOG FREE ZONE. No dogs will be permitted to enter unless they are a registered assistance dog.

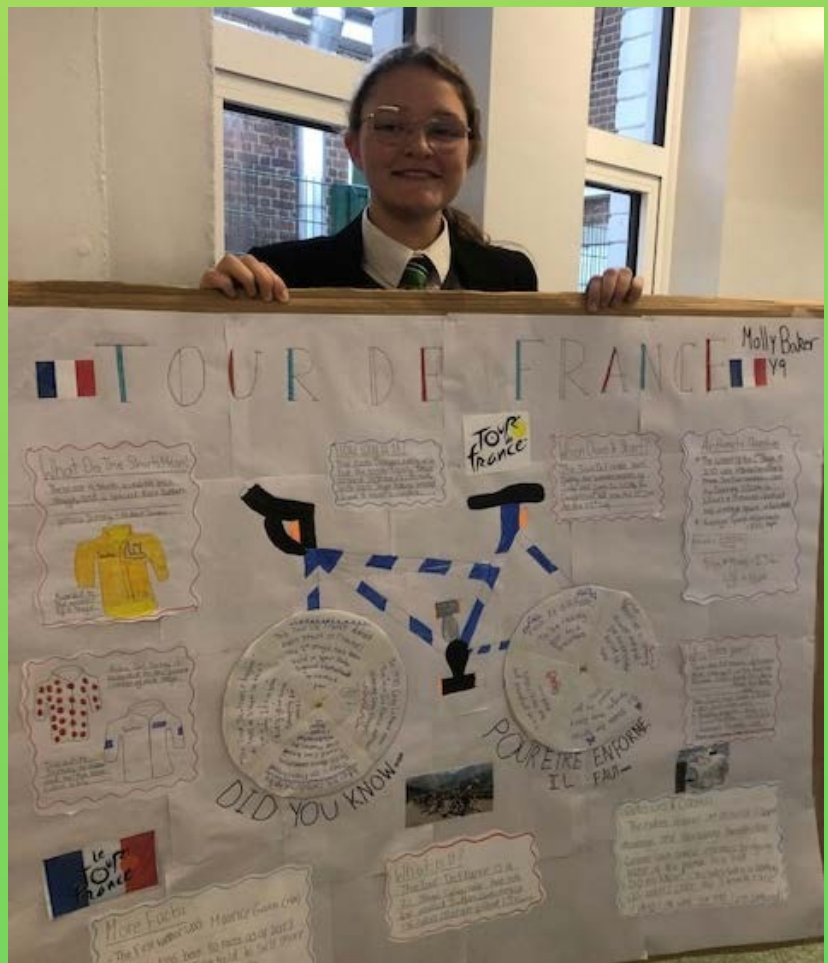

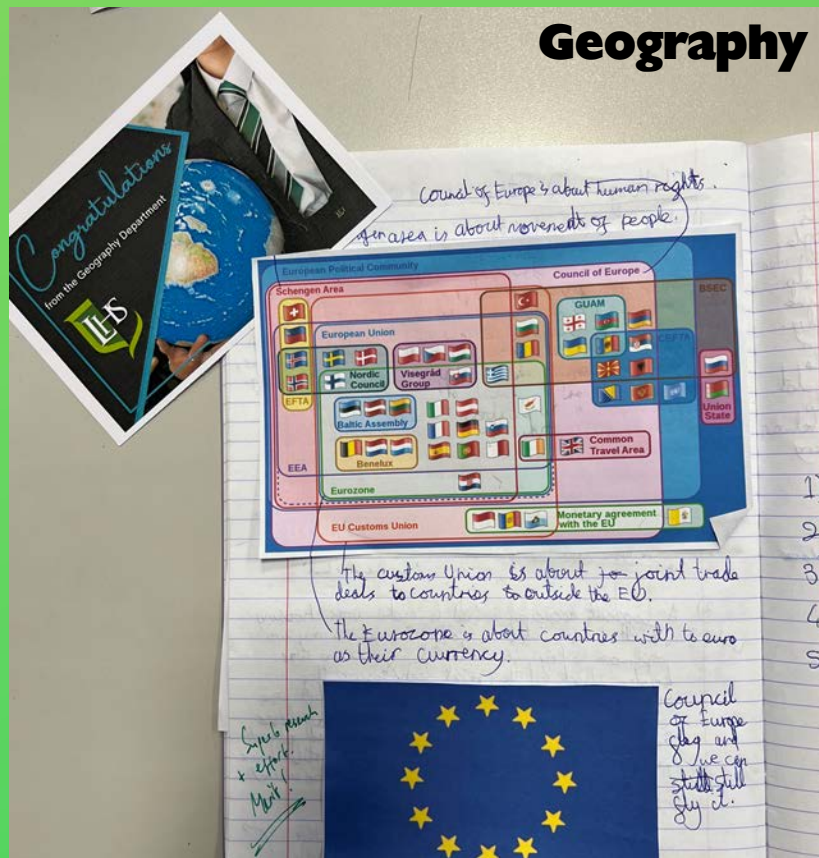

Year 10 ROW activity answering a question about the immune system

Pathogens can cause infections because viruses and bacteria make us ill. This can be seen by viruses who enter body and are so small they get into the cells and reproduce and make cells burst. Whereas bacteria create toxins that give us headaches and pains. However white blood the immune system defends us from these as platelets stop open wounds by creating clot and make it scar or whereas white blood cells create antibodies that target special bacteria viruses to quickly stop you this is why you only get chicken pox once and antibodies that cancel out all the toxins released by the pathogens. Our skin produces anti microbial secretions to destroy pathogen bacteria.

Pathogens can cause infection by producing toxins in your system. For example, viruses take over the cells in your body and bacteria divide rapidly by splitting into two. Bacteria produce toxins called toxins which make people feel ill. The immune system defends the body against these pathogens by ingesting the pathogens, digesting and destroying them so they cannot make us ill. Another way could be producing antibodies. These antibodies (cancel out toxins) released by the pathogens.

Human defence responses

Pathogens cause infections, viruses and bacteria are examples. Viruses cause infection by affecting our cells and bursting them while also reproducing to attack more cells. Bacteria cause infections by creating toxins to attack cells. The immune system defends these attacks in a variety of ways. For example, white blood cells ingest microorganisms, they take in pathogens and digest them to destroy them.

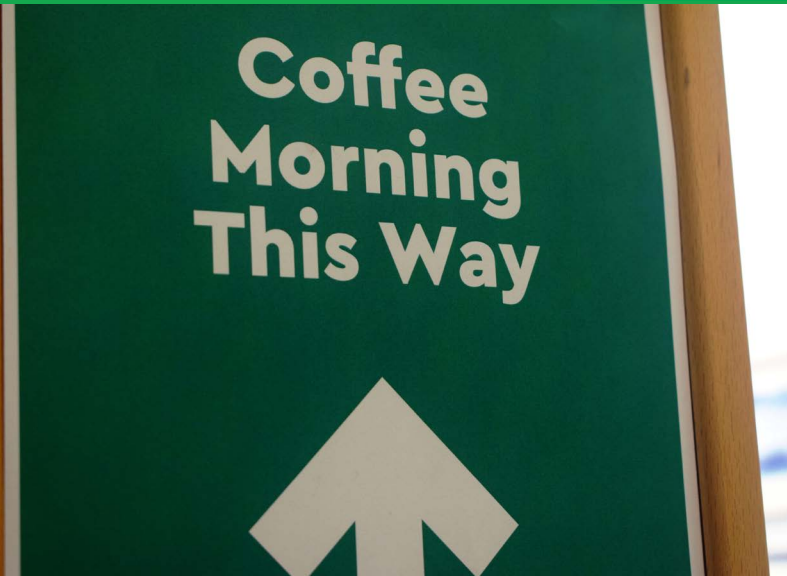


CHARITY CORNER

OPEN EVENING

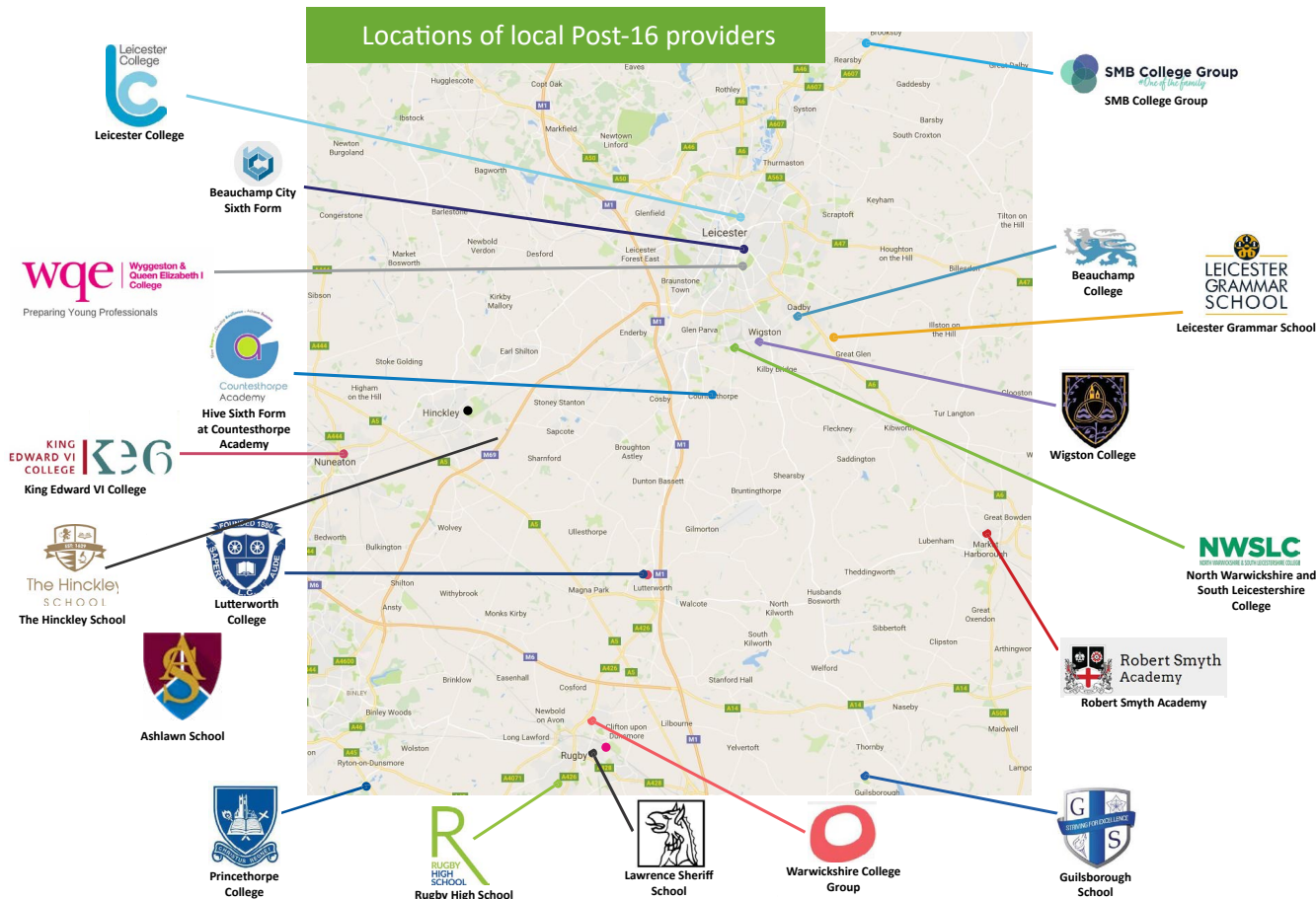

It's easy to use and is accessible from a smart phone, tablet or PC. You can use the app to report an absence easily and also book appointments for your child's Parents' Evening.

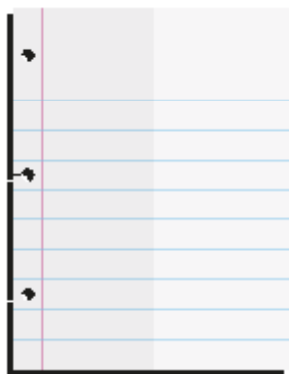
