This is the first in a new series, suitable for keen readers and lovers of intricate fantasy worlds.

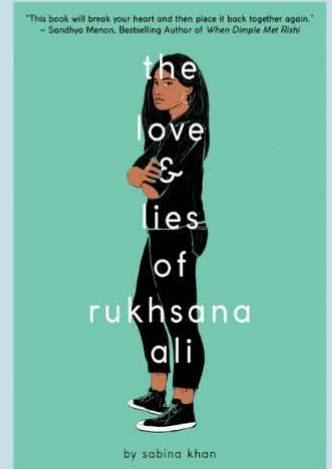




## Reading Role Models

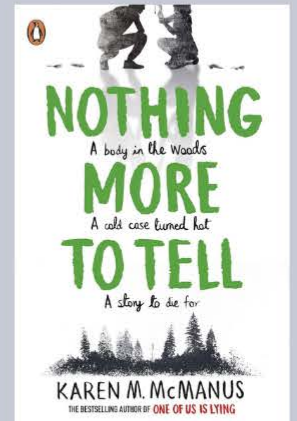

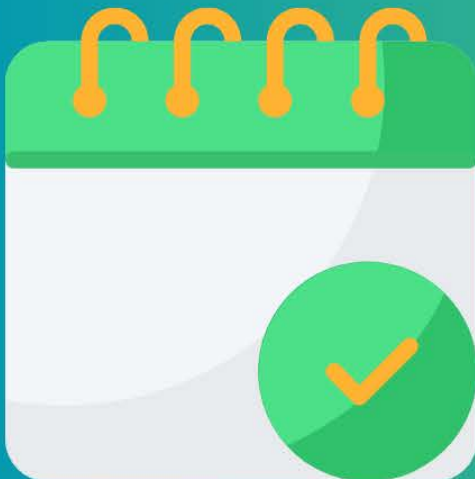
This week in assemblies, we celebrated the success of our students, celebrating the highest achievement points and subject awards.

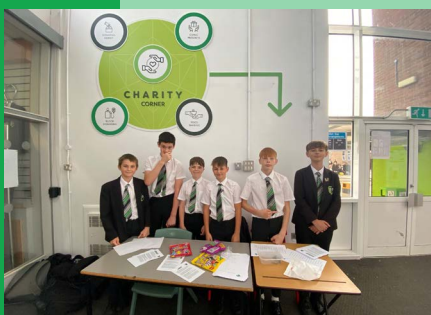


# CHARITY CORNER

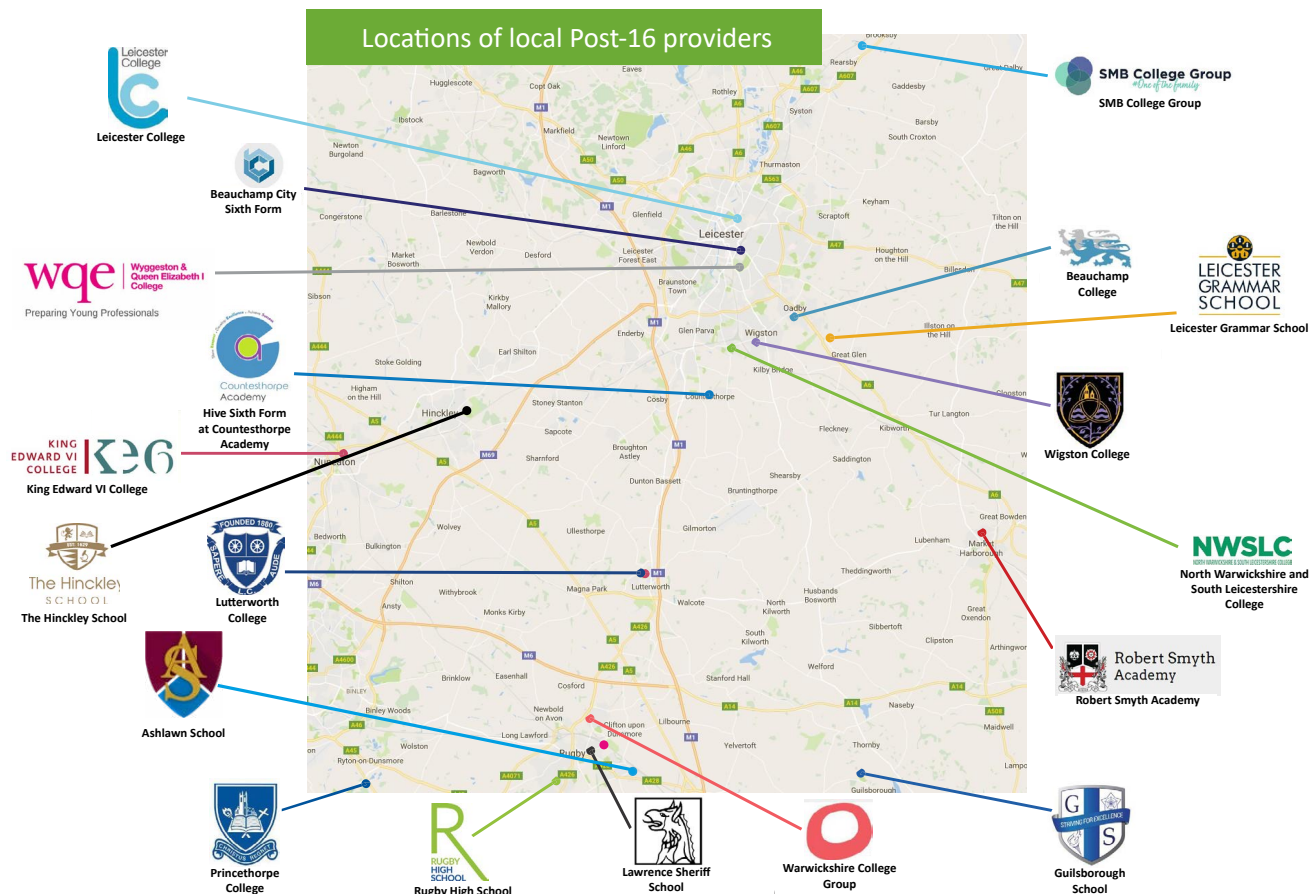

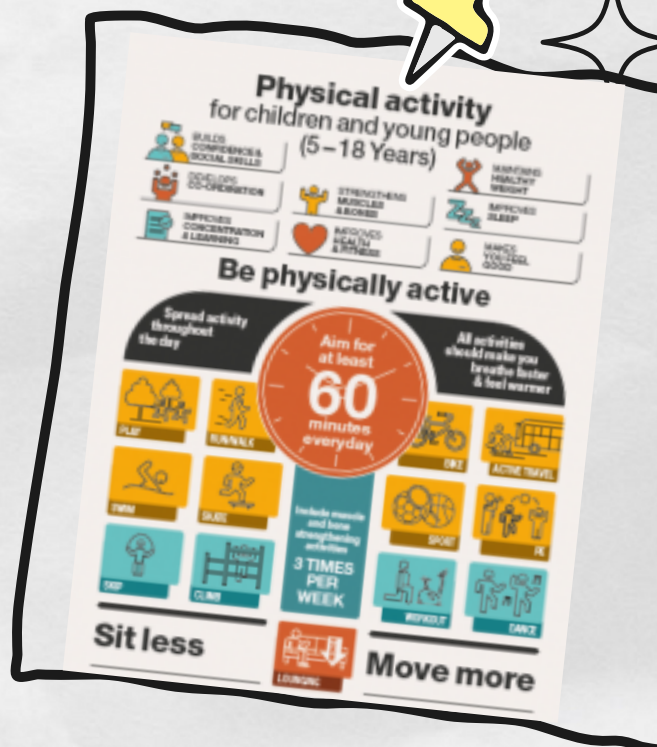

It's easy to use and is accessible from a smart phone, tablet or PC. You can use the app to report an absence easily and also book appointments for your child's Parents' Evening.

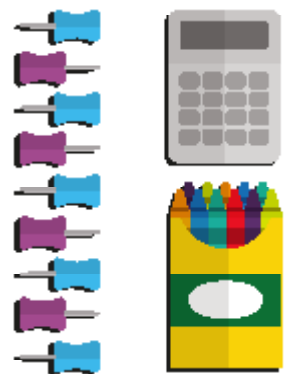
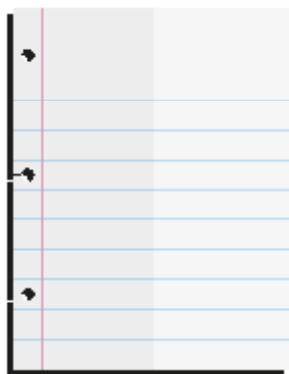
