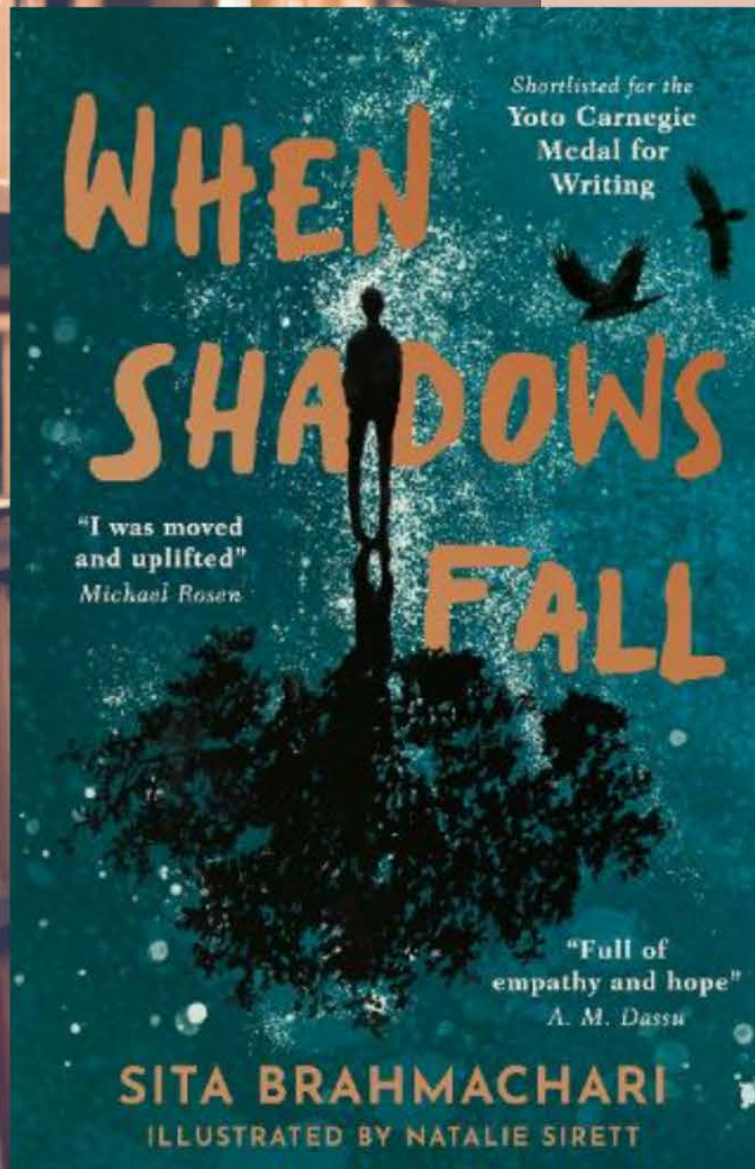

Om, a refugee, comes to Kai's aid with friendship and understanding. As Kai seems ever more doomed, Zak, Orla and Om pull together to try to save him. Saving the Rec becomes a metaphor for their struggle.

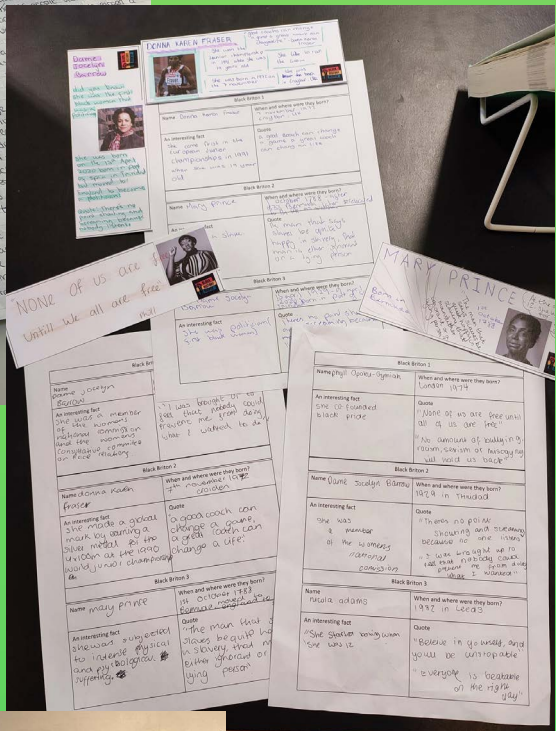
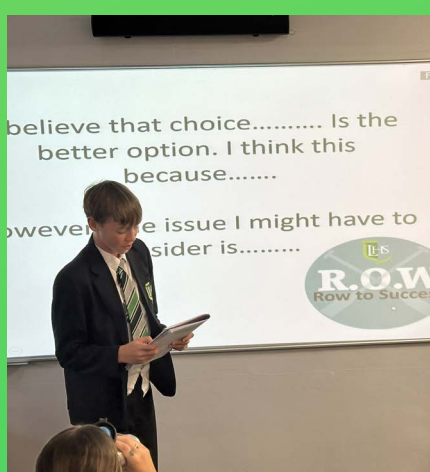
Students put some worn paper from books that were unsavable to good use by making some spooky creations!



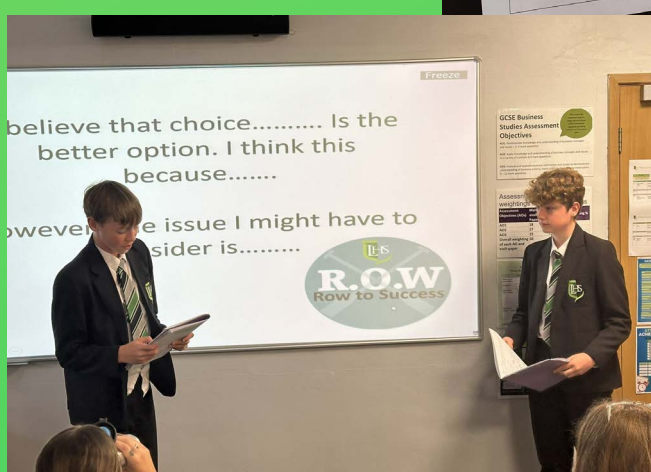
In English, Year 10 produced some fantastic creative writing homework based on vaccines; demonstrating excellent ROW skills.

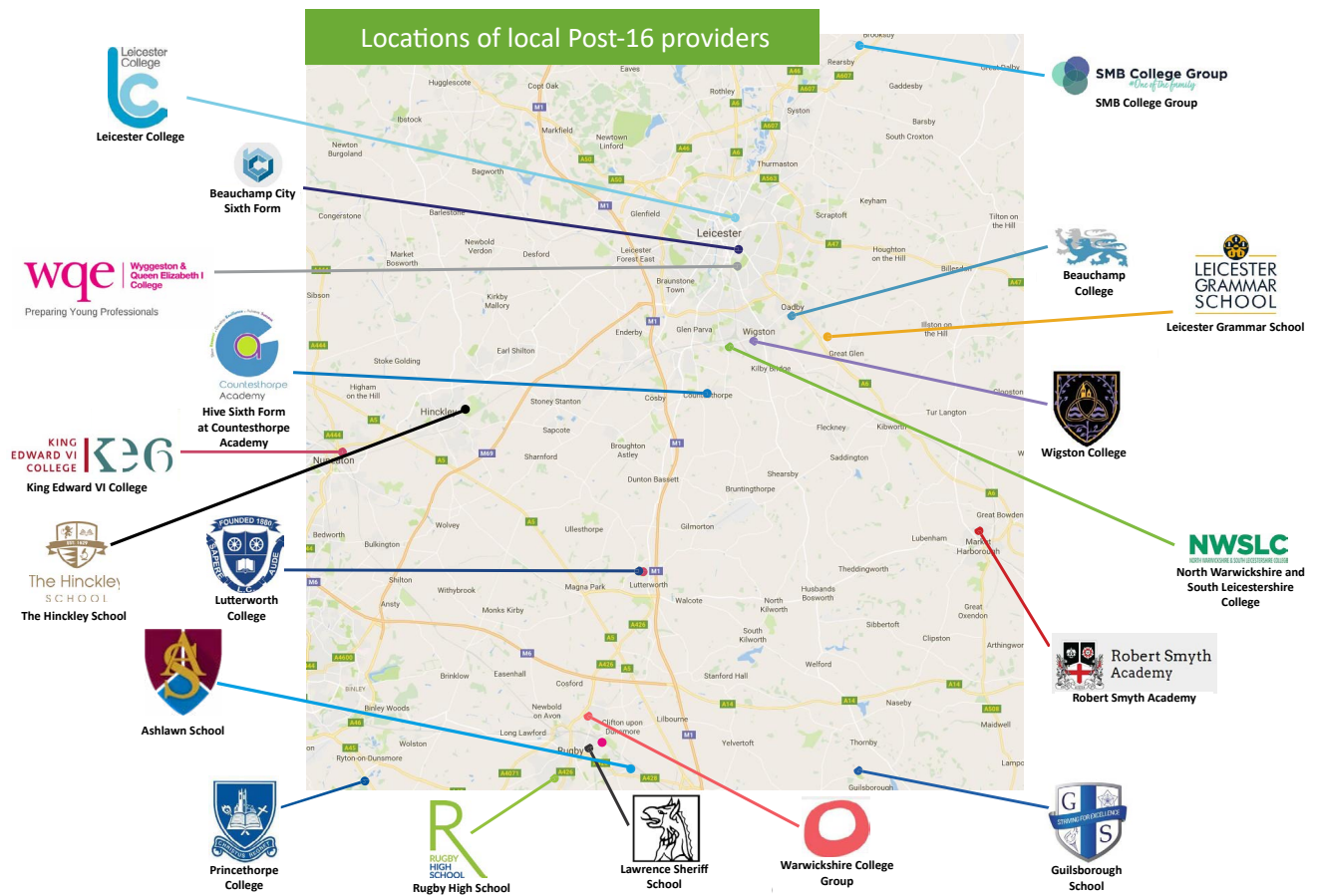

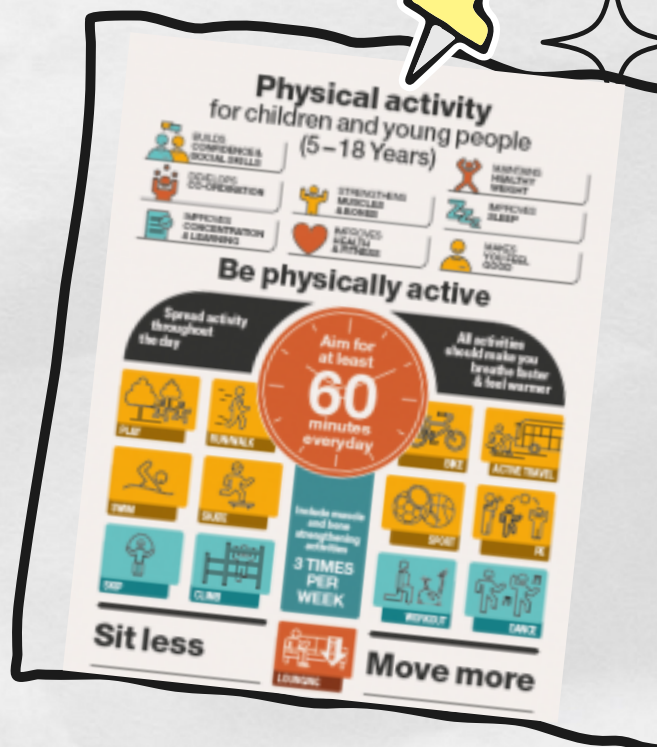

It's easy to use and is accessible from a smart phone, tablet or PC. You can use the app to report an absence easily and also book appointments for your child's Parents' Evening.

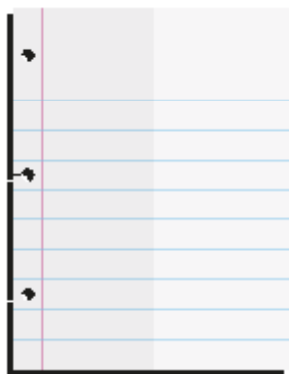
