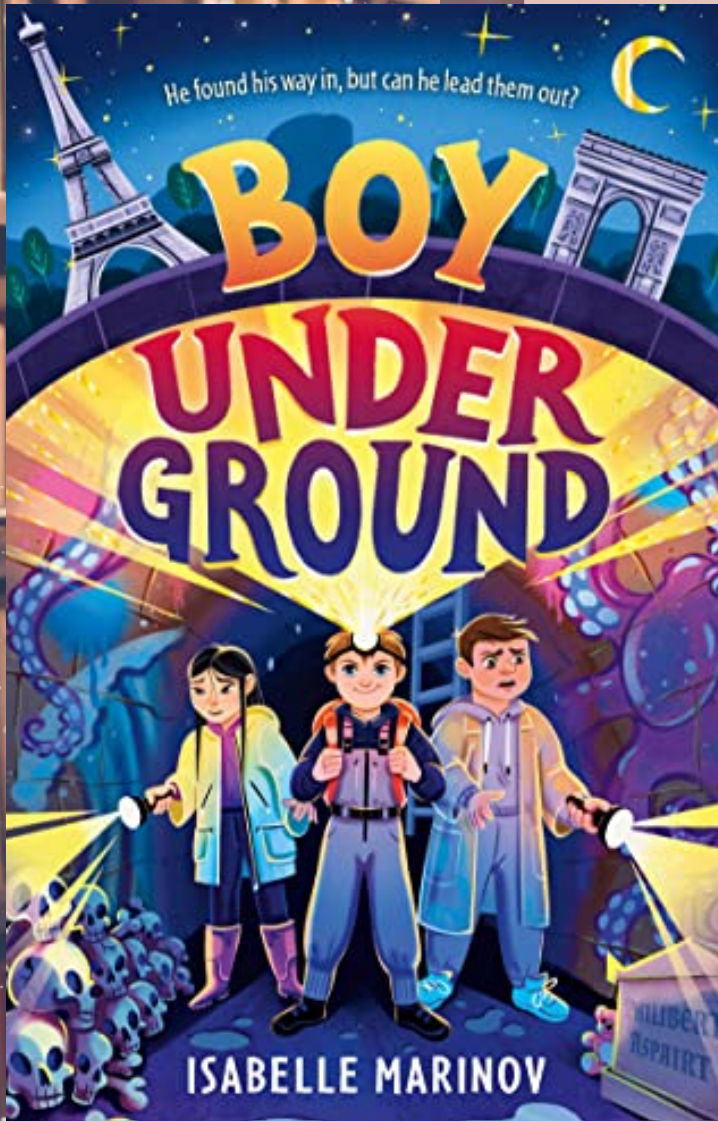

Navigating secret passages, narrowly escaping robbers and returning to old friends, Hugo discovers more than just buried treasure ...

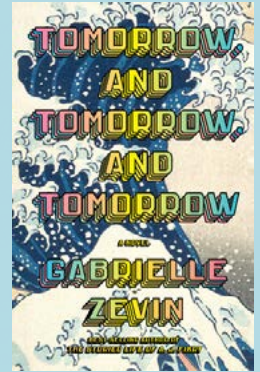




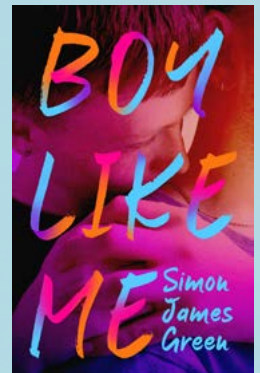
## Reading Role Models

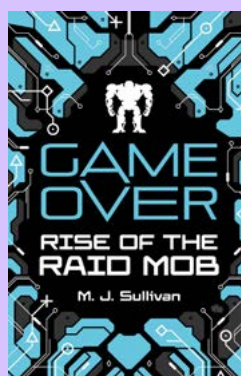

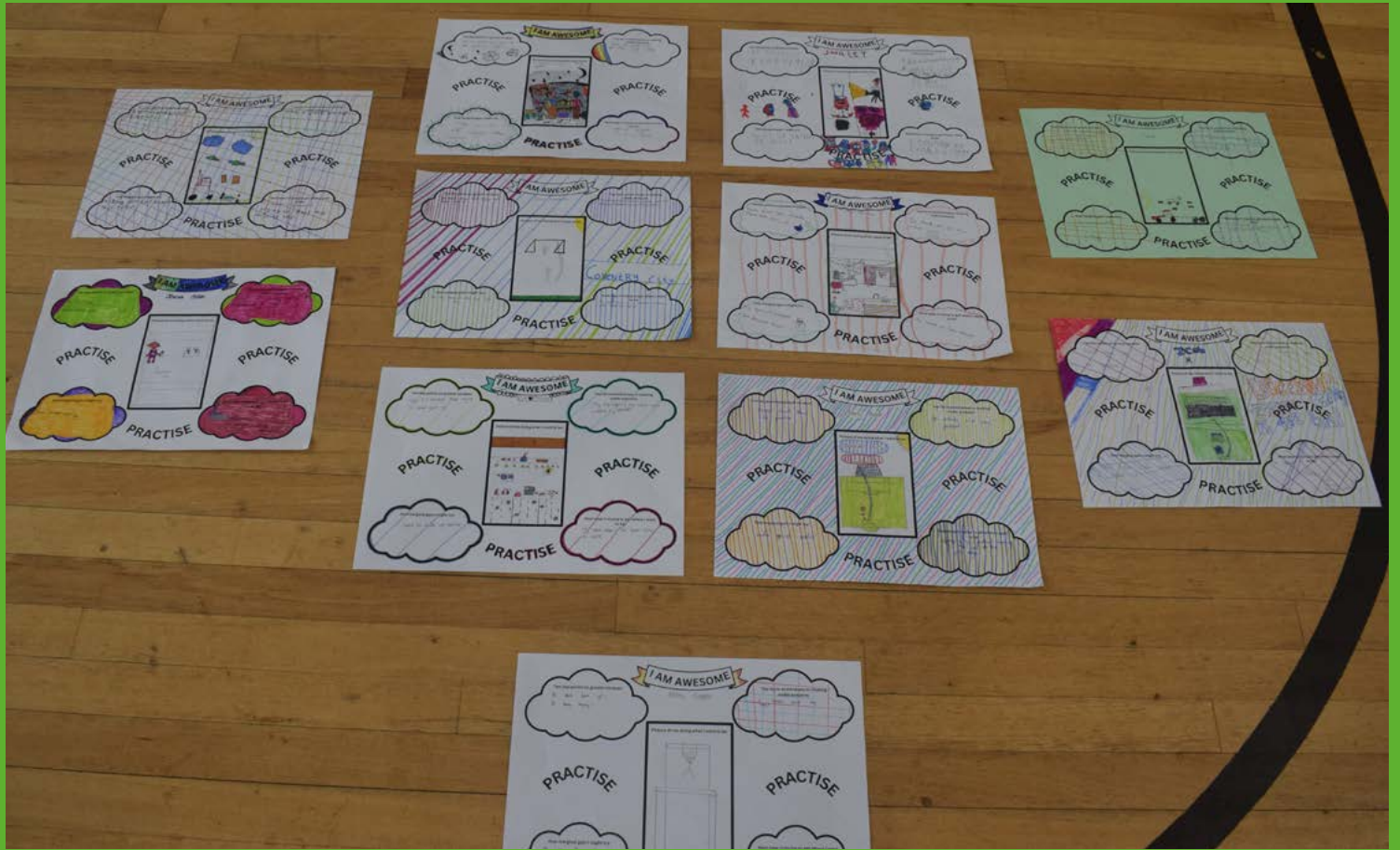


# WOW WORK

Students used a variety of ingredients to create these tasty masterpieces!





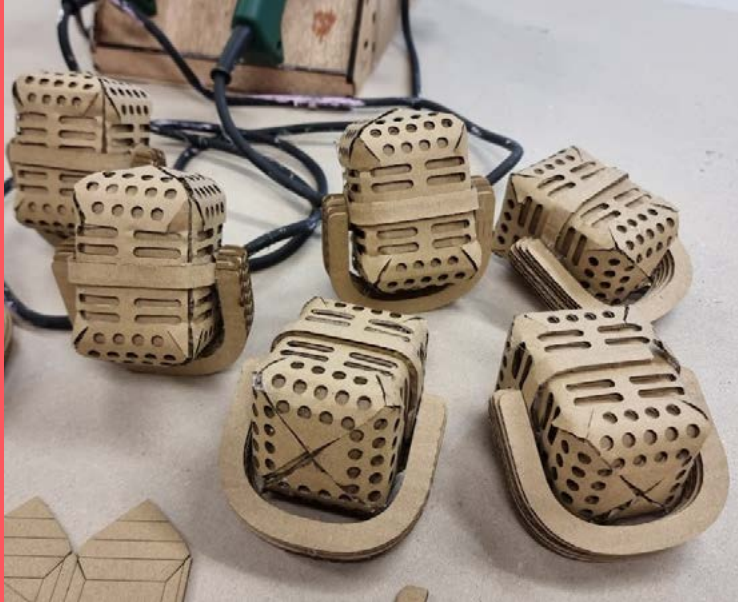

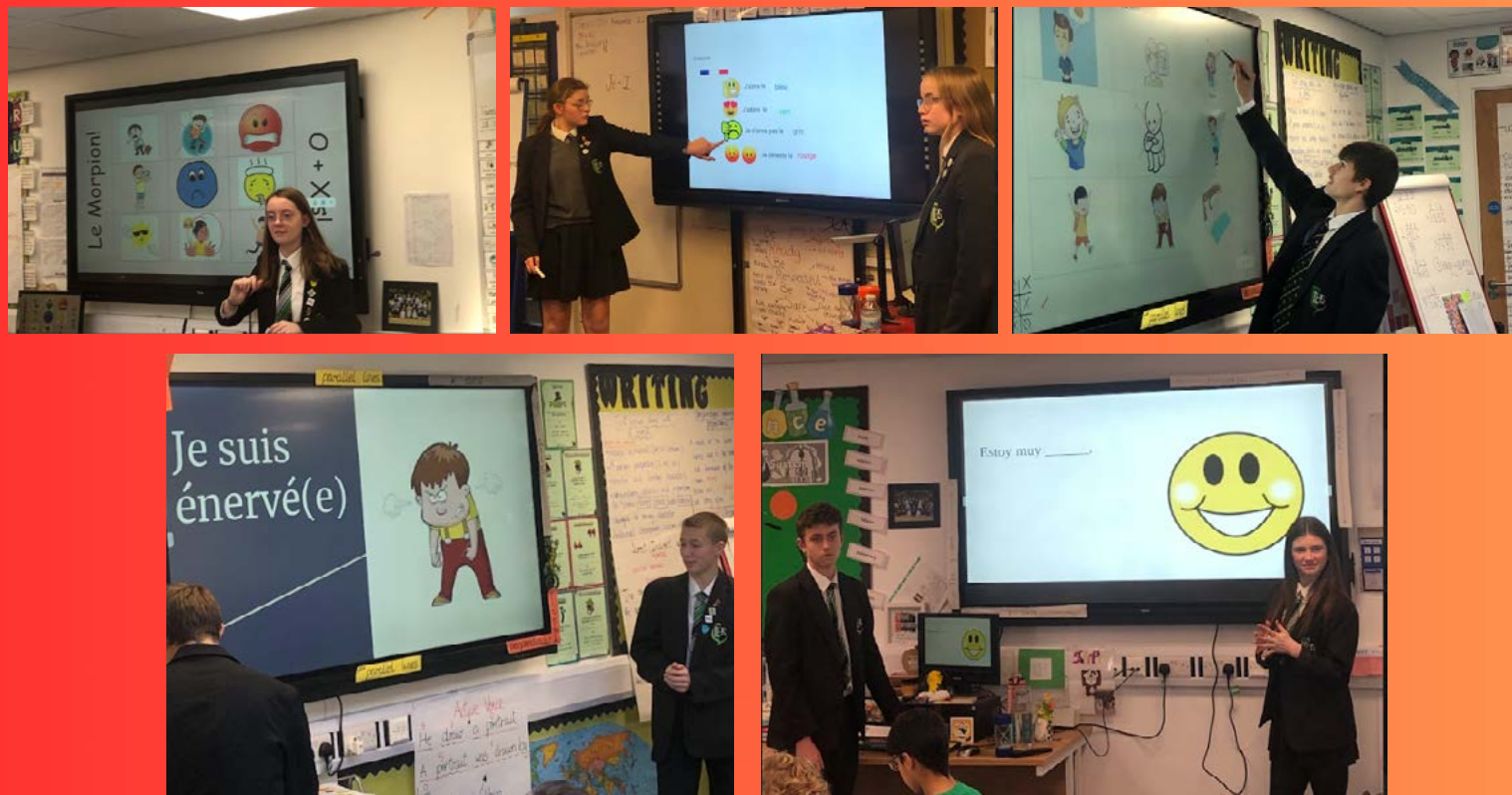

# Vaping

### WHAT IS VAPING?

Vaping is inhaling vapour from an e-cigarette or 'vape'. Most vapes contain nicotine which makes them highly addictive. Vapes come in a variety of colours and flavours making them popular with young people. It is illegal to sell vaping products to anyone under the age of 18, however, more young people are vaping and the figure has risen by 50% in the past year. Experimental vaping among 11 to 17-year-olds in Britain increased from 7.7% to 11.6%. **Source Sky News**



### Did you know?

Advertising Standards Authority has ruled that e-cigarettes and vaping products shouldn't be promoted on public Instagram, Facebook and TikTok accounts. This includes influencer marketing.

### WHY IS MY CHILD VAPING?

There are many reasons young people may try vaping.

- To fit in, young people can feel pressured to do what their friends are doing.
- To relieve stress or anxiety, many young people feel vaping has a calming effect.
- Young people can be drawn to vaping because of the bright colours and sweet smelling flavours.
- Curiosity, they've seen others vaping and want to experience it.

# WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF VAPING?

The government have identified 3 key issues we are facing with young people and vaping.

- **Addictive products;** Research has shown that most e-cigarettes contain traces of nicotine, which is highly addictive and can harm brain development.
- **Health implications;** The short-term side effects of vaping include throat and mouth irritation, headache, cough and feeling nauseous. The long-term effects of vaping are still unknown.
- **Risks and dangers from 'counterfeit vapes';** The metal coil that is used to heat up the oil in the chamber is produced from a very cheap metal, which can heat up too quickly causing the vape to either explode or split and spurt out hot oil which can lead to facial injuries.

It's easy to use and is accessible from a smart phone, tablet or PC. You can use the app to report an absence easily and also book appointments for your child's Parents' Evening.

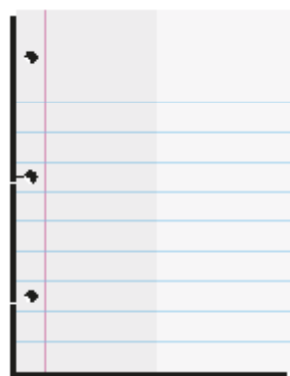
