Andrew Bernard Visit

As I'm sure you know, healthy relationships are now part of the PSHE / SRE curriculum so it's important it is covered during school as part of our statutory responsibility.

On 7th February we are being visited by Andrew Bernard who will be leading assemblies with Year 9 and workshops on themes surrounding consent, boundaries, unhelpful masculinity, coercive control and aspirational role models. He will invite students to consider how the media portrays themes linked to unhelpful masculinity and encourage students to know what to do if they or someone they know experiences coercive control.

Andrew is an inspirational speaker. He comes highly recommended, and when he delivered sessions to our students last year the students gave very positive feedback about the sessions.

We believe it is very important that we address these difficult themes in an age-appropriate way with our students, but we also recognise that they may evoke some challenging emotions amongst some students. We will have pastoral staff present throughout the workshops to support any student who may find the content difficult.

Routes into STEM virtual experience provides an exciting opportunity to explore the various routes you can take towards your STEM career. Who is it for?

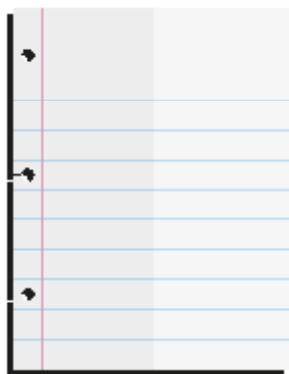
