It's normal to feel this way. We all experience lots of emotions and these can change over time.

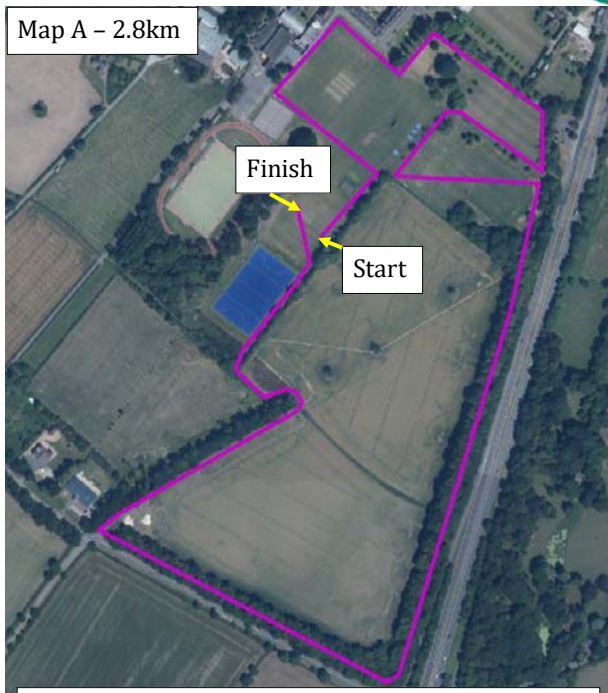
