Objective

At Lutterworth High School we have a proactive and caring student body who raise considerable sums of money for local, national and international charitable foundations. The objective of this policy is to outline the protocol for managing the large number of fundraising requests.

Protocol

Students are encouraged to be innovative and creative in their fundraising strategies. All fundraising requests will need to be forwarded to the student council. They will consider the request(s), which will then be subject to final approval by the Senior Leadership Team and Headteacher.

Non-uniform days raise a considerable amount of money for charitable organisations. The number of non-uniform days held per academic year and the fundraising cause will be at the final discretion of the Head teacher. Due to the limited number of non-uniform days which can be held in one academic year these days will be limited to supporting charitable organisations.

Cake and baking sales are a popular method of fundraising. These are encouraged, but their frequency will be monitored, due to our commitment to providing and promoting healthy food.

Lutterworth High School has a large number of students who actively participate in sporting, musical and performing arts events and activities. It is not unusual for our students to attend international training camps or competitions. Lutterworth High School cannot directly support students financially towards these costs, unless the student is entitled to pupil premium or meets the eligibility criteria set out in our Financial Support Policy. If this applies to your child please make contact with the school. Students who are not pupil premium can fundraise to support their activities, subject to the approval of the Student Council and the Senior Leadership Team and Head teacher.
